Intellectual output 1

The Scout Analysis for Job Requirements - has been effectively completed.

The output took the form of a Report comprising online self-assessment to map out the GAP between the digital skills of the of long-term jobless adult migrants and/or refugees and the needs of the labour market.



More precisely, the Scout Analysis for Job Requirements, it's an on line self assessment which adapts the framework of Digital Competences 2.0 to the needs of long-term unemployed migrants/adults, to foster their digital competences, in particular those needed to implement work-related activities as well as, to set learning goals and easily identify tailored training opportunities. The output is a transparency path capable of evaluating "digital-literacy" competences within the European framework of Digital Competences 2.0.



Intellectual output 2

The recently completed Intellectual output 2 - Massive Open Online Course (MOOC) is our greatest accomplishment, as it's the highlight of our project.



The development of the MOOC (massive open online course MOOC), marked a significant milestone for the project in 2022, signalling a new area of interest for online learning and potentially connecting higher education for migrants focusing on their digital skills.

All partners worked together to create the framework, which now contains five completed and useable modules available for free online.

- Module 1 - Information and Data Literacy
- Module 2 - Communication and Collaboration
- Module 3 - Digital Content Creation
- Module 4 - Safety Online
- Module 5 - Problem Solving

The goal is to provide migrants with the knowledge and skills to digitally connect with others in order to improve future career prospects and raise possibilities of integration in European countries by utilizing their acquired competencies.

The potential impact of MOOCs on the future of migrants residing in host countries in Europe has been subject to controversy over the years. Some professionals view MOOCs as a revolutionary force, whilst others remain doubtful.

During the launch of the new migrant platform, Prof Carlo Smaldone Villani, President of Prometeo, "If massive online open courseware means having a lot of migrants and low-skilled workers watching online presentations & videos with the support of teaching assistants throughout the duration of the project, this is certainly a major step forward in distance learning."



Francesca Pastorino Smaldone Villani, added: "The project has brought together expertise from partners with very different backgrounds and commitments, scattered across Europe, so this new world of online education sounds like a new paradigm for teaching migrants, particularly with regard to their digital skills."
